I-Tip & K-Tip Extension Care Form

Washing and Styling

You must follow the directions provided to you by your certified stylist and use only products approved by your certified stylist in order to prevent damage to the I-tips/ K-tips and your own hair. We suggest our own hair care line. Do not use It's A10 line as it will cause discoloration to your extensions. You have twice as much hair, so rinse twice as much leave your conditioner on your extensions for at least 2-3 minutes. If you are spending time in the sun please remember that sunless tanners and certain sunscreens used on the body will discolor the extensions. If this happens your hair will appear yellow or even orange. Please contact your stylist and they will provide you with an appointment to gently clarify your hair. Shampoo one or two times on your scalp only while letting the shampoo run through your ends. While conditioning your hair and the extensions, do not apply your conditioner to your scalp, but only apply to your midshaft and ends. Applying conditioner directly to your scalp can cause your I-tips to slip and also create the need to wash your hair much more often than needed.

As your extensions age, leave conditioner on for a longer time. Run fingers along scalp in "Z" shape pattern and run fingers through your cylinders/ K-tips. Towel dry hair as much as possible; your extensions will retain much more water than your natural hair. Air/Rough dry at least 60% before running a brush through your extensions/natural hair.

Do not go to bed with wet hair or put your hair in tight pony tails while wet and please let your partner know NO HAIR PULLING 😊

DO NOT wash or blow dry your hair upside down as this may cause tangling.

If you are receiving blow-dries from a stylist other than the professionals at our salon please be sure to ask them if they are certified in extensions. We advise that you only receive blowouts or styling with a certified extension specialist only!

Coloring

Serious damage may be caused to your Extensions and to your own hair by chemical treatments at home, or by hairdressers not thoroughly familiar with extensions. This is because color or perming chemicals may be trapped in the attachment cylinders, where they can continue to affect and possibly damage the Extensions or your own hair. All chemical treatments of your own hair should be carried out at a certified stylist studio. The range of color changes possible with Hair Extensions is limited by certain chemical factors understood only by your professional certified stylist.

Cutting

Hairdressers not familiar with Extensions may damage it by cutting it too short or by using the incorrect technique. Please make sure to contact your Certified Stylist when looking for a trim.

Maintenance Program

As your hair grows, the cylinders attaching the I-Tip Extensions will move further away from your scalp along with your own hair. This can increase the tension, traction and friction on your own hair. Therefore, it is necessary for you to return to your certified stylist every 4 to 6 weeks, or as advised by

your stylist. The reason is to have the attachment cylinders returned to or replaced to their original positions. Failure to do this may result in tangling and/or loss of some of your own hair and also a loss in the manufacturer's guarantee on the Extensions. Furthermore, it is vital you return to your certified stylist within one week of the initial fitting of your Extensions so your certified stylist can ensure that the system is satisfactory to your needs. This will also assist in determining suitable hair care regime at home and in the studio.

Brushing Technique

Extra care must be taken when brushing the hair to avoid dragging (pulling) the cylinder attachments. Hold your hair close to the base and brush from the ends working your way up the shaft of the hair. Recommend paddle or boar bristle brush- loop brushes not required. Do not use brushes with beaded tips on your scalp like the Wet Brush as it can cause damage to your hair and your I-tips.

Swimming

When swimming it is advisable to: braid or put your Hair Extensions into a ponytail as this will prevent knotting. Rinse your hair in fresh water and apply a conditioning treatment or leave-in conditioner to your, hair midshaft through the ends, to keep chlorine, salt or other environmental elements from altering your hair extensions before going into pool or ocean as well as rinsing once you get out. Apply a detangler or leave-in conditioner once you get out of the water

Sleeping

We suggest sleeping on a smooth silky surface (silk pillow case) that is non-abrasive and will assist in taking care of your Extensions while sleeping. Do not go to bed with wet hair Loosely braid or put your hair into a ponytail when sleeping.
